Award Criteria:

Spirit of Collaboration – to recognize MOH members and/or member organizations that have done outstanding collaborative work significantly moving comprehensive cancer control activities forward in West Virginia. There are three distinct levels for this award:

State – demonstrates the collaboration/integration of their projects with the current WV Mountains of Hope Cancer Plan resulting in change to policy, systems, and/or environment on a statewide platform.

Regional – demonstrates the collaboration/integration of their projects with the current WV Mountains of Hope Cancer Plan resulting in change to policy, systems, and/or environment on a regional/county-wide platform.

Local - demonstrates the collaboration/integration of their projects with the current WV Mountains of Hope Cancer Plan resulting in change to policy, systems, and/or environment on a local community platform.

Lifetime Achievement Award – to recognize MOH members that have dedicated 20 or more years to cancer control and prevention. The recipient must:

- Have demonstrated their passion for working in the field of cancer control and prevention;
- Have 20 years or more working in the field of cancer control and prevention; and
- Have helped to make WV great by outstanding contributions to the establishment, development, advancement, and/or improvement of the Mountains of Hope Cancer Coalition’s mission and vision.

The recipient:

- Does not need to be a native of WV, but a minimum of 20 years of cancer-related public health activity in WV is required. (Can be waived by a 2/3 affirmative vote of the Steering Committee.)
- Shall be an active member of Mountains of Hope for at least 20 years.

Order of the Bell – recipients of this award are breaking barriers to public health as it relates to cancer. Induction into the Order of the Bell should be viewed as the ultimate in recognition. This award will go to individuals who:

- Are breaking barriers to public health as it relates to cancer;
- Have proven through action the integration among the others areas of chronic disease; and
- Helped make the nation great by outstanding contributions to the establishment, development, advancement, or improvement of the cancer continuum – prevention/early detection, treatment, and end-of-life.

The recipient:

- Does not need to be a native of WV, but a minimum of 5 years of activity in cancer-related public health in WV is required. (Can be waived by a 2/3 affirmative vote of the Steering Committee.)
- May have been employed by a government agency or may have achieved his/her accomplishments individually or within the realm of the private sector.
